WHY THE OPTION FOR THE POOR?



Pope Francis began to experience the ire of many Catholics from is first day as bishop of Rome. He chose the name Francis because he felt called to be a defender of the poor people of the world. In this role, Francis pointed out that the economic system based on the unbridled pursuit of wealth means that people are sometimes sacrificed for the sake of profit. Jobs are lost, wages are cut, prices are raised creating even greater poverty. The wealthy and powerful advocates of the prevailing economic model did not like what Francis said and some of them have funded a fierce campaign against him. This is all public knowledge.

Why is Pope Francis such a champion of the poor? Why does the Church make a preferential option for the poor? Are the poor better, holier, more moral than others? Are the rich bad or immoral? This is certainly not what is implied.

God loves everyone, rich and poor, the strong and the weak, the lucky and unlucky, the fortunate and unfortunate. God has favourites. However, God is always on the lookout for those who are being put down, whose infinite worth and dignity is not recognised or respected. When the good things of the earth are being appropriated by a few and leaving the many languishing without the necessities of life, God is moved and asks us to open our eyes, to be compassionate. and to something about it.

The Kingdom of God is where nobody is ignored, neglected, regarded as dispensable or second class. Our God and King intervenes to rescue those people whose dignity and value is denied, ignored or negated in any way. He is the Good Shepherd who carries the weak, binds up wounds, and feeds the hungry. Our King is the lover of the poor.
