THE PASSION IN LENT



Mel Gibson's movie, *The Passion of Christ* was a box office success but it was a serious misrepresentation of Jesus and the gospel. The film spilled oceans of blood, and exposed acres of torn skin and bleeding wounds. There is none of this in the New Testament.

St. Mark's gospel devotes half of one verse to the crucifixion "there they crucified him and divided his clothes among them" (Mk. 15, 24). When St. Paul, the first and maybe greatest preacher of the Gospel, spoke of the passion he put it like this, "He loved me and gave himself for me" (Gal. 2, 20). That's the true and only passion of Christ.

Among other things, the biblical story of the passion is about how the power and might of Roman justice and Jewish Law combined to crush, humiliate, shame, and defame Jesus, his message and his mission. Jesus was a good and innocent man but was publicly condemned and declared a blasphemer and criminal. Political iustice and religious law together killed the son of God. But God was with Jesus, and in the resurrection God declared him innocent and right, and thus exposed human justice and religious law as corrupt and self-serving. This is a sobering warning for all time.

It is God who declares who is right and what is right. Jesus is the righteous one and Roman justice and Jewish law were both exposed as serving the interests of the powerful and the wealthy at the expense of the innocent and the weak. In the light of the passion, there is no longer any easy identification between human law and divine justice. This is an important lesson to be pondered during lent.
