American writer The and Youtuber, Jack Kornfield, guotes this guirky poem about the duck on the Atlantic. He calls it 'Duck Meditation. The writer is inviting us to take some time to meditate; to be quiet. Five minutes is a good place to begin. To notice everything going on in our mind; our hopes, plans, worries, contradictions, loves and hates: and to let them all be: to say hello to them all. This practice allows us to cultivate respect and a caring attention for everyone and everything.
