Christmas is a great time for children. There is so much colour and imagination. Today we will see the excitement of the young boys and girls as they play their parts as angels, shepherds, wise men and even sheep. We may even be surprised to see superman at Bethlehem. Mystery and imagination go together. It is imagination that enables us to see the invisible and to believe in the wonderful.
