JESUS AND SUFFERING



Jesus of Nazareth is the teacher, model and guide of Christians. He invites his disciples to take up their cross and follow him. He spoke quite openly and told his closest friends that he would suffer and die, and suggested that they too would suffer if they followed him. To be a follower of Jesus is to accept that suffering will be an intrinsic part of discipleship.

Jesus suffered but did not seek suffering. He had enemies who threatened him and plotted to destroy him. He was the victim of powerful and cruel people who brought false charges against him and insisted that he be put to death by the Romans as a blasphemer and traitor.

Jesus could have avoided suffering by abandoning his mission. He could have heeded the many threats and returned to his quiet life in Nazareth. Both the Jewish leaders and the Romans were angry with his preaching that was often directed against the ways they were hurting ordinary people. They wanted him to stop but he refused.

Jesus suffered not because he saw some intrinsic value in suffering. He suffered because he would not stop preaching the Good News of the Kingdom and healing the poor and the suffering. He was steadfast in fulfilling the will of his Father.
