The fall of the city of Bukavu into the hands of the rebel group "M23" and the "Congo River Alliance", Sunday, February 16, 2025, marks the beginning of a long night of uncertainty and suffering"

PRAYING DURING LENT



As a young man, St. Augustine was searching for a happiness he could not find. His heart was unsettled as he longed for something that seemed always just out of his reach. He studied the philosophers but remained unsatisfied. Then, suddenly, he discovered that what he was looking for was already residing within him. "Lord, I was looking for You out there while all the time You were here within me."

True prayer happens when we discover that God is always with us, and that we are already living in intimate union with God. Now at last we can relax as we realise that we do not have to make a huge effort, climb a high mountain, go on a difficult pilgrimage, do lots of severe penances to encounter the living God. God has made it easy for us by coming so close to us that He is really and truly dwelling within us through his Holy Spirit.

If we want to pray then we can unite ourselves to the prayer that is rising up from within our hearts every moment of every day. St. Paul tells us that the Holy Spirit is uttering a constant prayer on our behalf. When we don't have the words to pray or have no feeling for prayer, the Spirit is uttering a prayer for us and crying out, "Abba Father".

A very strong prayer is to unite ourselves with the prayer of the Spirit rising up from deep within our hearts. We can do this with or without words.
