## Who Do You Say That I Am?

The small group of friends, men and women who followed Jesus and witnessed daily such great things, cannot suppress the question: "Who is he?" They know where he comes from, they know his mother and relatives, they know everything about him, but the power of this man is so much out of proportion, he is so great and so different a personality, that every question takes a different meaning: "Who can he be?" In exasperation even his enemies will ask the same question, "How long will you keep us with bated breath? Tell us where you come from and who you are" (cf. Jn 10:24). They had all his details recorded, but these couldn't give them a full answer.... When Jesus passes with his disciples [by] Caesarea Philippi he asks them, *Who do people say I am? And you, who do you say I am?* The power of Peter's answer reaches out to us.... *You are Christ, the Son of the living God.* And Jesus replies...*You did not speak these words on your own accord...on you I will build my church....*

The question that Christ asks the apostles is the question of our life. No other question that man can think of is more grave or more decisive: the whole value of our life depends on the reply to this question; whether he existed as any other man or exists as the man-God.

If we consider the difference between the answer of his friends and that of the crowd that refuses him, we note that the apostles...were those who followed and lived with him. How can we answer this question?... How can we live out the familiarity with him, that familiarity in which his word becomes evident and the only one that gives meaning to life? There is a way: the companionship born of Christ has erupted in history: it is the Church, his body, the mode of his presence today.... [Life in the Church allows us to] repeat with certainty what he, unique in the history of humanity, said of himself: *I am the way, the truth, and the life.*
